ATUG will also have information about 3G mobile services, wireless broadband services, Digital Television, Internet Security, the Do Not Call register and the Telecommunications Industry Ombudsman scheme.

Since 2003 ATUG's Regional Communications Roadshow has visited over 45 towns, travelled over 55,000 kilometres and has spoken with 2,000 people
